Astronaut Terry Virts / How to Astronaut Thursday, Oct 12, 2023

Astronaut Terry Virts has served in the US Air Force as an F-16 fighter and test pilot, piloted the space shuttle *Endeavour*, served as commander for the International Space Station, and conducted three spacewalks during a 200-day mission in 2014 and 2015.

During his seven months in space, Terry took over 300,000 photographs and hours of video—the most of any space mission before or since. These images form the backbone of IMAX film *A Beautiful Planet*. National Geographic published *View from Above*, a book featuring some of Terry's best images alongside his reflections. On stage, Terry reveals the wonders of our world from above, personal insights into how NASA could have done better on previous shuttle missions, and, you know, *How to Astronaut*—which happens to be the title of his best-selling book.



Photographer Annie Griffiths / Through the Lens: Creating a Ripple Tuesday, Jan 23, 2024

Trailblazing photographer Annie Griffiths has worked on dozens of
magazine and book projects for *National Geographic* magazine
since the late 1970s. As one of the few female photographers at
the time, Annie photographed the stories not being told,



particularly the daily lives of women in developing countries. She is the founder of Ripple Effect Images, a nonprofit collective of prize-winning photographers and filmmakers who document programs that empower women and children in the developing world. Annie has received awards from the National Press Photographers Association, the Associated Press, the National Organization of Women, and the White House News Photographers Association. Named one of the "Best of the Best" speakers by the World Presidents Association, Annie has spoken to audiences at the United Nations, Sydney Opera House, and TEDx, among many others.

National Geographic photographer, filmmaker, and best-selling
author David McLain honed his photographic chops shooting
feature-length assignments around the world for *National Geographic* magazine. His assignments took him to six continents
and often required 200 days on the road each year. He's

photographed seven feature stories for *National Geographic*, shot for major brands like Sony and Apple, and was director of photography for the feature documentary *Bounce*, which premiered at SXSW in 2015. For 15 years, together with author Dan Buettner, David has traveled the world to study and document the world's five Blue Zones. His work on the Blue Zones project has produced several books, including a *New York Times* best-selling cookbook *Blue Zones Kitchen*, and stories for *National Geographic*, Smithsonian, and others. David is also one of the original Sony Artisans of Imagery.
