TALKING WITH ...

Micky Dolenz

Dolenz, the voice of the Monkees, has a show at the Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center in March.

Micky Dolenz has made a mark on many different elements of entertainment. from acting and singing on the well-known 1960s TV sitcom "The Monkees" to working on Broadway and radio and directing television and theater.

What can people expect from your upcoming show?

Essentially Monkees hits. I as blessed to be able to sing most of them, and I've always made sure that the audience gets what they expect, which is to hear those hits in their entirety. Then, depending on the venue, I'll mix up some of the album cuts. It's a little bit of a stroll through the '60s and

that era. If I do something that isn't a Monkees song, I usually have a story attached - of auditions, of being at one of the Beatles sessions. My sister and I will do a few duets and stuff from the new album, "Good Times," and we'll tell little funnv stories.

Since Neil Diamond wrote "I'm a Believer" for you, and he recently announced that he'll be stepping down from touring, what was your reaction to that news?

I was dismayed when I heard about it. He sure helped me with my career. It's just a shame. He's such a powerhouse performer and songwriter.

You have a lot of theater experience. Are you looking to do another play?

I'm always looking. Sometimes I've had to actually pass on a couple of offers because I was on the road. It kind of depends on my availability and if I get offered something. I would love to do something on Broadway again. I've done it a couple times and on the West End in London, as well.

So you have acting, directing and singing experience with TV, film and theater. How do all of these elements help make your own show unique?

I'm not the one out there in the audience watching me, so I can't say. I guess it all adds up, but it essentially comes down to the quality of the music and keeping my voice strong, and frankly, to the quality of the material. I've been blessed to have some of the greatest writers in the world writing for me - just some really phenomenal songwriters. When you have really good material, it's actually kind of hard to mess up. I suppose the same would apply to film.

What is your favorite part about being an entertainer?

I like all the different disciplines. I like the acting, the singing, the directing, the writing, whatever it may be for me. It comes down to the material. I'd rather be acting in a great Broadway musical than directing a lousy show. It's the underlying material, whatever it is. I just jump on that for a while until I move onto something else.

Last year you released a live album, "Out of Nowhere." Can you tell me a little about that album?

It's wonderful. I was asked if I wanted to perform my songs with a 40-piece orchestra, a classical proper orchestra. I jumped at the opportunity. I thought that was so cool. I always wanted to do a whole concert like that, and we did. We went to Portland, Oregon, and we were doing all the Monkees tunes with the orchestra. Then a record company said they'd love to put it out as a proper recording, so we were able to do that.
