Currently, a level one acting class is available for students ages 14 and up. "Basics for the Actor" is taught by The Sharon's artistic director, Whitney Morse.

"I usually have people anywhere from 17 years old all the way up to 80 (year olds)," Morse said. "It's great to have age diversity in the class."

Besides acting fundamentals, students also will learn about the parts of the stage and theater lingo, Morse said.

"I hope people walk away with a firm sense of the nuts and bolts of what it is an actor actually does to prepare for a role, and have a beginning sense of how to navigate playing a modern scene," Morse

"Basics for the Actor" is a sixweek course that meets from 6 to 9 p.m. Tuesdays, from Aug. 14 to Sept. 18. The course is \$250 per student.

"I love getting to know my students and watching their work change and grow over the course of six weeks of training," Morse said.

"My classes are very fun, but I also expect a lot from my students," Morse said. "While we only meet once a week, it is required that students meet with their scene partners outside of class to rehearse their assigned scenes and to get off book.
