host a summer party and a Christmas party, help with food packing, and perform handyman tasks such as yard work and minor repairs for some of the homebound clients.

Krupski was concerned no one would come to the first party the club hosted for LovExtenstion.

"But in talking with the clients, I found they were thrilled to be asked to a party," Krupski said. "Often as people age, they can do less and are sometimes alone, and they get forgotten."

She and her volunteers try to make sure that doesn't happen.

LovExtension has grown as Krupski has learned of additional needs from working with her clients. There is often a need for extra food, incontinence supplies and even pet

food, and the Rotary Club has been an important part of helping meet those needs,

> she said. Rotarian Ava Norris, of the Village De La Vista, coordinates the club's volunteer work with the food pantry.

> "I've only been with Rotary for about year, but I love how involved we are in the community and around the world," Norris said. "That was the draw for me."

> Norris is excited about another new project that includes Rotarians. Rotary members will visit LovExtension clients on their birthdays.

"A lot of times there is no family close by and their birthdays aren't remembered," Norris said. "We'll visit them and take a little gift and a card. We just want to make them feel special."

From popular tunes and operatic melodies to classical scores and holiday music, fans of the philharmonic are in for a well-rounded musical experience this season.

Even though the VPO has been between seasons, members of the orchestra have stayed active this summer.

VPO founder and conductor Pasquale Valerio has filled the months with traveling and music, from attending a festival in California to guest conducting orchestras in Italy.

Vocalists and musicians of the VPO put on a summer

concert series at Temple Shalom. The series will end at 7 p.m. Aug. 26 with "Tanglissimo," a concert of music by Bach, Chopin, Piazzolla and Srebrakowski.

Then, the VPO will open its 2018-19 season with a pops concert at 7 p.m. Sept. 2 at the Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center.

"We will have a fantastic team of Florida guest singers," Valerio said. "It will be mostly American music and medleys. We celebrate any kind of genesis.'

The pops concert will be followed by an opera gala in October, Part I of Handel's Messiah in November and two holiday concerts in December.

Later in the season, the orchestra will perform more classical, pops and opera concerts. Individual tickets, which
