VOTERS IN LAKE AND MARION COUNTIES HEAD TO POLLS TO BEGIN EARLY VOTING FOR SPECIAL ELECTION

One of the biggest issues for voters in November was knowing their ballots were lengthy. As early voting starts today in Congressional District 6, local residents only have one race to remember. "It will probably take people longer to walk to their car or from their car than it will to vote," said Wesley Wilcox, Marion County elections supervisor. The district — which includes Flagler and Putnam counties and parts of Lake, Marion, Volusia, Flagler and St. John's — is holding a special primary after U.S. Rep. Mike Waltz announced he was leaving to serve in the Trump administration. Two Democrats and three Republican candidates are running, meaning members of both parties can participate in the closed primary. "We're ready for everybody and we hope they all take the elections seriously and come out and vote," said Alan Hays, Lake elections supervisor.

WHERE TO VOTE **IN THIS MONTH'S ELECTION**

Early voting starts today and runs 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. through Jan. 25 in Marion and Lake. Voting sites will not be the same as they were in November since the Jan. 28 primary is not a county-wide election for either county. However, the closest site to The Villages in Lake is still the Lady Lake Community Center and the closest in Marion is still Mulberry Grove Recreation.




BY MAIL IN THE PRIMARY

The deadline for voters to request mail ballots be sent to them has passed and anyone who has a mail ballot should send it in soon. The United States Postal Service recommends mailing ballots at least a week before the deadline, which is 7 p.m. Jan. 28 in Florida. Voters can also use the secure ballot intake stations at their county's early voting sites to turn in their ballots.

The Sharon

Comedy legend Vicki Lawrence kicks off the comedy season at 7 p.m. Jan. 31 at The Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center.

Lawrence is famous for her role as Thelma Harper, better known as Mama, a character she originated at the ripe old age of 24 on "The Carol Burnett Show" and the spinoff "Mama's Family."

Now, the Émmy Awardwinning comedienne is taking Mama out on the road and into 2025 in "Vicki Lawrence and Mama: A Two-Woman Show."

"My show is not a retrospective," she said. "The show is a mixture of stand-up comedy, music and my observations about real life."

During the show, Lawrence shares anecdotes about her time on "The Carol Burnett Show" and "Mama's Family," her brief stint as a singer and her life today.

After warming up the audience with jokes about gynecological visits and a rendition of her 1973 hit, "The Night the Lights Went Out in Georgia," Lawrence dons the silver wig and pastel ensemble of Mama, who has much to say about the state of the world today.

Some of the many modern topics Mama touches upon include automatic toilets and their tendency to flush before people are done, same-sex marriage and human cloning.

"Where Mama is concerned, expect the unexpected," Lawrence said. "She doesn't always get things right, bless her heart, but she has very strong opinions."

» Ryan Hamilton is a new favorite in the New York stand-up comedy scene, appearing on "The Tonight Show" with Jimmy Fallon, "The Late Show with Stephen Colbert" and opening for Jerry Seinfeld at Carnegie Hall. Now, the star of the Netflix special "Happy Face" is coming to The Sharon at 7 p.m. Feb. 8. Tickets are \$32 and up. "Workin' Man" comedian Dusty Slay will make a pit stop in The Villages at 7 p.m. Feb. 25 at The Sharon. The Nashville-native made his Grande Ole Opry debut in 2019 and has been climbing the comedic ladder ever since, appearing on "The Tonight Show" with Jimmy Fallon, "Jimmy Kimmel Live!" and releasing his first hour-long Netflix special, "Workin' Man," in 2024. Tickets start at \$35.

» Comedian Ben Brainard made a name for himself on TikTok, where he is known for poking fun at events happening in the United States by parodying the states and their various personalities. He now tours the country, but the Florida native will make a stop closer to home at 7 p.m. March 1. Tickets start at \$35.

» Lewis Black, the Grammy Award-winning comedic actor known for playing Anger in the Pixar Academy Award-winning film "Inside Out," stars in the "Goodbye Yeller Brick Road: The Final Tour" show at 7 p.m. March 6. Tickets start at \$62.

- » Former worship leaderturned-comedienne Heather Land will bring her empowering brand of humor and dole out practically hilarious advice at 7 p.m. March 13 at The Sharon. Tickets start at \$35.
- » Comedian William Lee Martin, otherwise known as the "King of Cowtown," and his 10-gallon hat come to The Villages as part of "The Funny Life Tour" at 7 p.m. March 14. Tickets start at \$35.

Tickets for Nealon's stand-up show are \$75 and up.

Brad Upton, star of the 2019 Dry Bar comedy special "Boomer Triggers Gen-Z Snowflakes," performs at 7 p.m. Feb. 15 at The Tracy. Tickets start at \$45.

After Upton, renowned comedian, actor and producer Howie Mandel returns to The Villages at 7 p.m. March 12 at The Tracy. Tickets for Mandel's show start at \$85. Jon Lovitz, a comedian and actor known for films like "The Wedding Singer" and guest appearances on TV shows like "Friends," is the most recent addition to The Tracy's 2025 schedule. He will perform his comedy show at 7 p.m. March 21 at The Tracy. Tickets start at \$55 and go on sale Wednesday.

In addition to the wellknown comedians, there also are a few locally renowned acts returning to Savannah Center.

"At Savannah Center we are bringing back Steve Solomon's 'My Mother's Italian, My Fathers Jewish and I'm in Therapy,' as Steve discussing his hilarious family is always a hit at Savannah Center," Higby said. "Also, this March we will have Andy Cooney's 'Irish Celebration,' featuring an all-Irish comedy duo that blends music, laughter and dance, which is sure to bring a smile to your face around the St. Patrick's Day holiday."


