Villages Charter School Reveals New Look at Buffalo Ridge Campus

The campus at the northern end of the community will open for the 2024-25 school year with a new look.

The Villages Charter School's Buffalo Ridge campus will usher in a new era with the start of the 2024-25 school year.

Details about upcoming changes were revealed Tuesday night at the final Buffalo HERD meeting of the current school year.

The moves will complete a transformation for VCS that began with the opening of a second campus in Middleton last fall.

The entire process has been eight years of planning and almost four years in the making, said Randy McDaniel, director of education.

"You're basically refreshing

an entire campus that's been serving students for 24 years at the Buffalo Ridge campus," McDaniel said. "If you do it right, and I think we have, it could serve students for another quarter century."

For the 2024-25 school year, The Villages Charter Middle School at Buffalo Ridge will be at 251 Buffalo Trail — the former site of The Villages High School. Extensive renovations at that building will be completed this summer and ready for classes this fall.

The renovations include new flooring, paint, signage,

Prepare Now for a Busy Storm Season

It's Hurricane Preparedness Week, the annual reminder that the upcoming hurricane season is not far away and now is the time to prepare.

Researchers from the Colorado State University Tropical Meteorology Project are predicting an "extremely active" 2024 Atlantic hurricane season, which runs June 1 through Nov. 30. They predict 23 named storms and 115 named storm days, which count all tropical cyclones with winds of at least 39 mph. Although The Villages is far enough inland to escape storm surge and onshore winds, it is still important to be prepared, especially for possible extended power outages.

The Villages Public Safety Department hosted its 17th annual Hurricane Expo on Friday at Savannah Center so more than 40 local businesses,



technology, interactive teaching screens, furniture and classroom layouts. Former VHS academy classrooms will be repurposed for the middle school's needs such as the former Culinary Arts Academy being eliminated to add space to the cafeteria.

"We feel like, by the end of this summer, that we'll have two campuses that are state of the art," McDaniel said. "Modern technology, upgraded furniture, upgraded paint schemes and school logos are all on the inside. No matter what campus you're attending, whether its Buffalo Ridge or Middleton, you're going to a world-class facility.'

VCS meets high standards in test scores, graduation rates and other measures of achievement. The school as a whole earned an "A" rating every year since 2003 that the Florida Department of Education gave school grades.

VCS once again earned the "School of Excellence" designation from the Florida Department of Education this year. It has achieved the award each time it has been presented since the program was created by the Florida Legislature in 2017.

The charter school will

who will oversee the Buffalo Ridge campus next school year. "I think we will have the premier middle school campus in the state when all the renovations are done."

The rest of the Buffalo Ridge campus also will be reorganized for the 2024-25 school year.

The Primary Center, made up of kindergarten and first grade, will move to 521 Old School Road.

The Intermediate Center, which houses second and third grades, will move to 350 Tatonka Terrace.

The 4th and 5th Grade Center will move to 450 Village Campus Circle.

Each of those buildings was renovated over the previous three summers.

rowth has propelled all Gof these changes to the campus.

"We're anticipating to grow by 300 students each year over the next few years," McDaniel said. "We believe this is going to give us a nice long runway to serve all the families and folks who want to come here."

The renovations, however, will accommodate the increases.

"I love to see the growth as we are able to offer more students the opportunity to attend the charter school," Irwin said. "Renovating the campuses allows the students take over the building at 420 Village Campus Circle, which is currently known as the VCES Primary Center.

"We currently have students in our school with the autism identification, but we're able to serve Individualized Education Programs in the regular classroom through support with our inclusion model," McDaniel said. "But some students need more, so we've been thinking about this for a while and now is a good time to do it."

The school is in the early planning phases but is expected to open for the start of the 2025-26 school year. It is still subject to approval by the Florida Department of Education and the Sumter County School Board.

like Puccini's "Turandot," Mozart's "Don Giovanni" and Verdi's "La Traviata" at the orchestra's annual fundraising gala, "Magic Moments of Opera Scenes."

Most audience members were pleased to witness the return of tenor Francesco Malapena and baritone Stephen Mumbert, but it was the surprise debut of Bolivian-American soprano Lynette Tapia, who was not listed in the show's program, that truly captured their attention.

Acclaimed throughout the opera world for her "canary" embellishments and "crystalline coloratura," Tapia is a winner of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions as well as a first-place and 'Prix de la publique" winner in the Operalia Concours International de Voix d'Opera Placido Domingo. She recently took on the demanding role of Marie in "La Fille Du Régiment" by Donizetti with Parnassus Society in Orange County, California.

t the VPO concert, Tapia Acharmed the audience with her performance of "La ci darem la Mano" as Zerlina from "Don Giovanni," which she sang opposite Mumbert. Laughter rang out from the crowd as the Don seduced the impressionable ingenue away from her own wedding and the two minced about the stage.

Tapia and Malapena earned three standing ovations for their rendition of "Quel guardo, il cavaliere" from Don Pasquale," followed by another for Tapia, Malapena and Mumbert's combined song, which Valerio dedicated to all the mothers in the audience in honor of Mother's Day.

"It's the best night ever," Mary Feichtel said. "I thought it was just outstanding."

She said the performance from Mumbert, Malapena and Tapia made her want to go home and read librettos to better understand them. Like most of the audience, however, Feichtel was mostly filled with praise for Tapia.

Tapia joined the "Magic Moments of Opera Scenes' after being contacted by Valerio.

"I've known Pasquale for 17 years," Tapia said. "I met him in Europe, where I work and my husband as well, who's a tenor. You'll be meeting him soon."

Despite it being Mumbert's birthday, which the VPO honored with a spirited rendition of "Happy Birthday," patrons flocked to Tapia at the end of the show to introduce themselves and ask if they would see her at

more operas in The Villages. Thankfully, the answer was a resounding yes, as Tapia recently traded her life in California for one in The Villages. The decision was made at the behest of her husband and fellow opera singer, John Osborn.

"The main reason we are here is because he was like, 'I want to retire at 60,'" said Tapia, who is now a resident of the Village of Dabney. 'We've been at this a long time. People think it's glamorous, but it's a lot of work."

Despite the lack of formal announcement, Tapia considers her debut in The Villages a success. She said the community can expect to see a lot more of both her and her husband in the future.
