host him again in The Villages, where we know his music touches the hearts of so many."

Known for his "velvet voice," romantic ballads and classic Christmas song covers, Mathis is the third-best-selling artist of the 20th century. And with more than seven decades of performing under his belt, he has one of the longest recording careers of all time.

The singer also has three songs inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame: the 1957 recordings of "Chances Are" and "It's Not For Me to Say" as well as the 1959 recording of "Misty."

"His Christmas songs are probably the most recognizable," Varela said. "Of course, his biggest hits like 'Chances Are' and 'The Twelfth of Never' are beyond classics — they're standards."

Varela, who is a professional singer in his own right, shared the stage with Mathis at the Grammy Salute to Music Legends, which aired on PBS in 2019. The pair performed tributes to music legends Dionne Warwick and Julio Iglesias.

Mathis honored Warwick with a tribute of her Grammy-nominated song "Walk Ón By." Varela covered a Julio Iglesias song, but his segment was not included in the final cut of the show. Nevertheless, the two performed their sets on the same stage. At that point, Victory Productions already had brought Mathis to The Villages for a couple of concerts, so Mathis knew Varela only as a promoter. He had no idea Varela could sing. Varela said during his soundcheck for the event, Mathis hung back to watch Varela perform and even gave him a standing ovation once the song concluded. "I was flattered that one of the greatest singers of all time complimented me and took the time to hear me sing," Varela said.



The event, coupled with their mutual love of golf, cemented the bond between them, Varela said. It also paved the way for Mathis' return to The Villages, which will mark Victory Productions' last concert at The Sharon this season.

Varela refers to Mathis as a master of his craft and encourages patrons to take advantage of his return and come witness the "magic" of his concert.

"Johnny Mathis is one of the greatest voices of our lifetime," Varela said. "We never know if it's the last time he will be in town, so make sure you get a seat."

Tickets for the Johnny Mathis "The Voice of Romance Tour" are \$150 and up. Purchase at any Villages Box Office location or go to thevillages entertainment.com.
