



Significant Productions recently unveiled the lineup for The Sharon's ninth season, and SigPro staff can't

new and returning acts, with shows ranging from country music singers to '80s new wave and throwback bands, contemporary ballet, international groups, Broadway shows and the theater's own The Villages Philharmonic Orchestra.

Country music singer Terri Clark kicks off The Sharon's ninth season at 7 p.m. Aug. 23. Clark, who is a native of Canada, is a multi-JUNO Award winner and a CMA Female Vocalist of the Year award nominee. She is best known for her 2004 single "Girls Lie Too," which reached No. 1 on Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart, and is currently the only Canadian woman who holds a Grand Ole Opry membership.

Overall, there are 23 entertainment acts scheduled for this season, not counting the VPO's concerts. Some of the shows will have multiple performances. Of particular note is the upcoming Broadway series, which includes a number of critically acclaimed musicals such as "Dear Evan Hansen," "Tina: A Tina Turner Musical" and "Hadestown."

"I know the Broadway series is going to excite some folks, and me too," Morse said.

"Dear Evan Hansen," a Tony and Grammy award-winning musical about connection in the digital age, follows a high school senior with social anxiety who, according to playwright Steven Levenson, "invents an important role for himself in a tragedy that he did not earn." The musical comes to The Sharon on Nov. 6 and 7.

Coming December is "Tina: The Tina Turner Musical," which chronicles the life of Anna Mae Bullock from relative obscurity to her meteoric rise as Tina Turner, the Queen of Rock 'n' Roll. The last installment of this season's Broadway series is "Hadestown," an eight Tony Award-winning musical retelling of Orpheus and Eurydice. "Hadestown" comes to The Sharon in March 2025.

access to premium seating, Adkins said, ensuring that subscribers have the best possible seats for their chosen performances.

"Tickets are exclusively available to Broadway subscribers until July 2024, and for international subscribers until June 2024, providing an early opportunity to secure perfect seats for a night out at The Sharon," Adkins said.

Patrons can purchase yearly subscriptions for the Broadway and international series at thevillagesentertainment.com.

The VPO offers its own season subscription, which includes the "Labor Day Pops Orchestra Celebration" and "Italian American Celebration," the "Messiah," as well as holiday and classical concert series. "We have concluded a

great concert season at the beautiful Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center, and we are about to begin the 2024-2025 season with enthusiasm and above all, lots of beautiful music with extraordinary guest artists," said maestro Pasquale Valerio, music director of the VPO.

Having recently finished its 20th season, the VPO is older than The Sharon itself. Its founders, Valerio and the late Oscar Feliu, started toying with the idea of starting an orchestra in The Villages during the late 1990s, but it wasn't until 2003 that the group gave its first Christmas performance. As the community and the orchestra grew over the years, Valerio and Feliu gradually put on more concerts until 2009, when the orchestra performed its first full season.

The Sharon L. Morse Performing Arts Center's Broadway series is set to end in March

2025, with "Hadestown." Anaïs Mitchell's Tony Award-winning musical retelling of the


Now, the orchestra averages around 13 to 15 concerts per year, performing pieces that range from classical to modern and collaborating with musicians from around the world, like violinist Gennaro Desiderio, who is expected at this season's Valentine's Day concert, 'American Music Celebration of Love."

Valerio currently is on tour in Europe with the Beijing Opera Choir, the Beijing Opera Singers and an Italian orchestra, but when he gets back to The Villages, he will be gearing up for the annual "Labor Day Pops Orchestra Celebration," which opens the VPO season Sept. 1.

Single tickets for the VPO's subscription can also be purchased at thevillages entertainment.com or at the orchestra's main website, thevillagesphilharmonic.org.

"To all the audiences of The Sharon L. Morse and The Villages Philharmonic – come to the theater and support your orchestra in this extraordinary musical program," Valerio said.
